ACTION AS A RESULT OF EXECUTIVE SESSION

President Sellers stated there were items of business requiring action as a result of Executive Session.

Craig Roberts made a motion to allow the EDC to contribute \$25,000 to the NE Tx Rural Rail District for maintenance of rail lines, and to allow the EDC to assist the District with operational duties of making payment and deposits and minute keeping for a trial period of 60 days, provided we receive a disclaimer of liability. Tory Humphries entered a second. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

Tory Humphries made a motion for the EDC to make an offer to Project South Africa of \$2000 in job training and job creation funds per employee and up to \$27,000 in moving expenses with a caveat that they must use a Sulphur Springs carrier. Buck Booker entered a second. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

Buck Booker made a motion to continue in negotiations with Project Australia to build and lease a building with an option to purchase for up to five years, at which time to be purchased back by them. Clay Walker entered a second the vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

Clay Walker made a motion to move forward with Project Maple Leaf. Craig Roberts entered a second. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

Craig Roberts made a motion to move forward with Project Orangeburg at a cost of up to \$150,000. Tory Humphries entered a second. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

Craig Roberts made a motion to adjourn the meeting and Buck Booker entered a second. The vote was unanimous. President Sellers pronounced the meeting adjourned at approximately 1:34 p.m.
